

# 2022 CEV BEACH VOLLEYBALL CONTINENTAL TOUR – ZONAL EVENT ORGANISING TERMS & CONDITIONS



EVENT CONDITIONS	
<b>Event name</b>	“Zonal Association” Continental Tour-Zonal Event
<b>Application forms</b>	Fully completed BV-A2 including all requested enclosures plus the FIVB/CEV Zonal Tour Homologation forms
<b>Application deadline</b>	Min. 35 days before the event
<b>Competition Dates</b>	To be coordinated and approved by the CEV
<b>Number of events</b>	Five (5) events per gender per Zonal Association - Max. 1 event per gender per National Federation.
<b>Venue Facilities</b>	Set by the organising Zonal Association and in line with FIVB Official Beach Volleyball Rules and the CEV Regulatory framework
<b>Duration</b>	Min. 2 days Main Draw
<b>Participating teams</b>	Min. 12 teams Main Draw with a min. participation of 3 National Federations affiliated to the respective Zonal Association. Wild Cards may be allocated by CEV to non-member NFs in case the minimum number of teams is not achieved up to 25% of the entire number of teams scheduled in the full roster
<b>Prize Money</b>	Minimum of 1'500.- EUR up to maximum of 4'000.- EUR per gender per event
<b>Registration Procedure / Regulations &amp; Forms</b>	<p>Mandatory usage of CEV/FIVB online registration system and:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- CEV BV-01 Players Commitment</li> <li>- FIVB BVB -10 Health Certificate forms</li> <li>- Anti-doping Certificate &amp; Prevention of Manipulation Course</li> </ul> <p>via the following links: <a href="https://e-learning.fivb.com/access/loginCEV">https://e-learning.fivb.com/access/loginCEV</a> License fee of 20-EUR per athlete (once per season). <u>Registration Deadline</u>: - 21 days from the first Preliminary Inquiry <u>Confirmed Teams lists</u>: - 15 days from the first Preliminary Inquiry</p> <p>An entry/participation fee may be imposed according to the Competition Regulations of the respective Zonal Association</p> <p>Competition Regulations in regard of quotas, position of Host Country teams, competition format are according to the respective Zonal Association Competition Regulations. For any issues not covered within these regulations the CEV regulations shall apply.</p>
<b>Court Equipment</b>	In line with FIVB Official Beach Volleyball Rules, ball homologated by FIVB
ORGANISERS OBLIGATIONS	
<b>Zonal Association</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Enforce the FIVB Official Beach Volleyball Rules.</li> <li>✓ Assign by end of March, a contact person to collaborate for all competition related issues with CEV throughout the season.</li> <li>✓ Provide CEV with the Zonal Association Competition Regulations document latest 30 days prior to the 1<sup>st</sup> CEV-Zonal tour event of the season.</li> <li>✓ Appoint one Supervisor per event latest 30 days prior to the tournament. The Supervisor should appear in the CEV/FIVB Technical Supervisors/ Candidates list.. He/She will be responsible to coordinate and apply the tournament and competition parameters.</li> </ul> <p>He/She shall report before, during and after the event as per the instructions of CEV and the Zonal Association concerned.</p>

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<b>National Federation/ Organiser</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Provide the Practical Info template to the CEV and affiliated National Federation the <u>latest 30 days prior to competition</u></li> <li>✓ Propose the list of event referees and Referee Manager through BV-LR form to CEV for approval, with a minimum of 3 referees per court out of whom 1 International BV referee./Candidate, <u>latest 20 days prior to the tournament. All referees should appear in the referees list in the vis with a proven record of officiating in the last 2 seasons.</u></li> </ul> <p>The proposed Referee Manager should be either a CEV/FIVB Referee Delegate or an FIVB International Beach Volleyball Referee and <u>cannot act as a Referee during competition</u>. National Federation may propose for CEV approval a person not featuring in the above lists, presenting proof of his/her prior involvement and experience in Beach Volleyball referee matters. He/she needs to be fluent in speaking, reading and writing English and will be responsible to coordinate refereeing issues and report to the Zonal Association/CEV following respective guidelines.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Assign a VIS manager latest 20 days prior to the tournament to run the competition software with a good understanding of Beach Volleyball competitions and prior VIS experience.</li> <li>✓ Forward a competition preview and a daily report at the end of each competition day to the CEV Press Officer, accompanied with a minimum of 5 photos.</li> <li>✓ Assign a Hygiene Officer and apply CEV Beach Volleyball Hygiene Guidelines if requested by CEV</li> </ul>
<b>Post Event Report</b>	<p>7 days after the event at the latest, the organiser shall send to <a href="mailto:beach@cev.eu">beach@cev.eu</a> a post event report including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– the respective CEV Post Event Report form or the Zonal Association Post Event Report form, if existing, duly completed and signed</li> <li>– photos of the competition courts plus venue supporting facilities and areas</li> <li>– around 20 high resolution pictures for each competition day</li> <li>– samples of all printed materials (posters, leaflets....)</li> <li>– samples of produced uniforms (if provided)</li> </ul>
<b>Media rights and production standards</b>	<p>National TV rights, all other broadcasting rights remain with the CEV CEV is the ultimate owner of all media rights in relation to the event (domestic and international media rights). In case the Organiser wish to exploit such rights in national level they shall contact the CEV latest 15 days prior to the start to agree on productions standards. in terms of camera layout, integration of TV graphics and signal transmission In case of production, the Organiser shall respect the CEV broadcasting standards.</p>
<b>Ranking Points</b>	<p>Subject to FIVB confirmation and in case all organising terms and conditions fulfilled</p>
<b>Comp. Software (VIS)</b>	<p>Yes, (mandatory usage for the allocation of FIVB/CEV ranking points)</p>
<b>MARKETING &amp; PROMOTION</b>	
<b>Venue branding &amp; Marketing</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– Three CEV/CEV Campaign panels plus minimum 1 event title in each court as per the provided layout</li> <li>– One CEV flag in a predominant position in the venue/tribune.</li> <li>– Uniforms and all image and identity materials needs to be submitted for CEV approval prior to production.</li> </ul>
<b>Promotional Productions</b>	<p>Use of the CEV marks in all publications and promotional activities (posters, banners, leaflets, backdrops) following the CEV guidelines and respective approval prior to production</p>
